- o Reiterates the recognition that CC is development issue, notably in developing countries and presents challenges as much as opportunities in efforts to increase development effectiveness.
- o On CC finance, quantity and quality are of great concerns to both developed and developing countries.

  - o Countries
  - o Governments (of recipient countries)
  - o International funders working at the country level
  - o International funders working globally
- o Follow-ups of these recommendations will inform the discussion of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Phase
