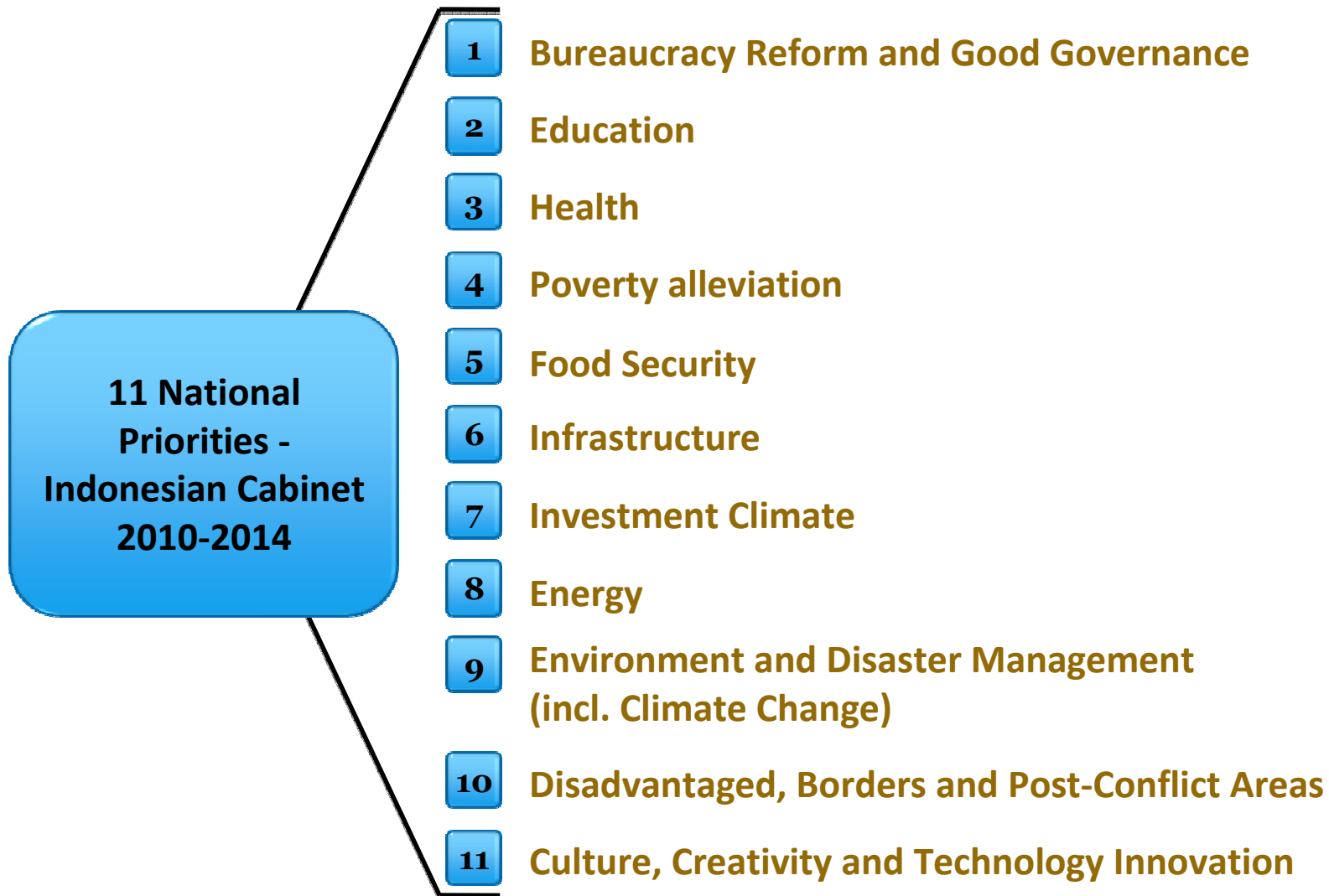

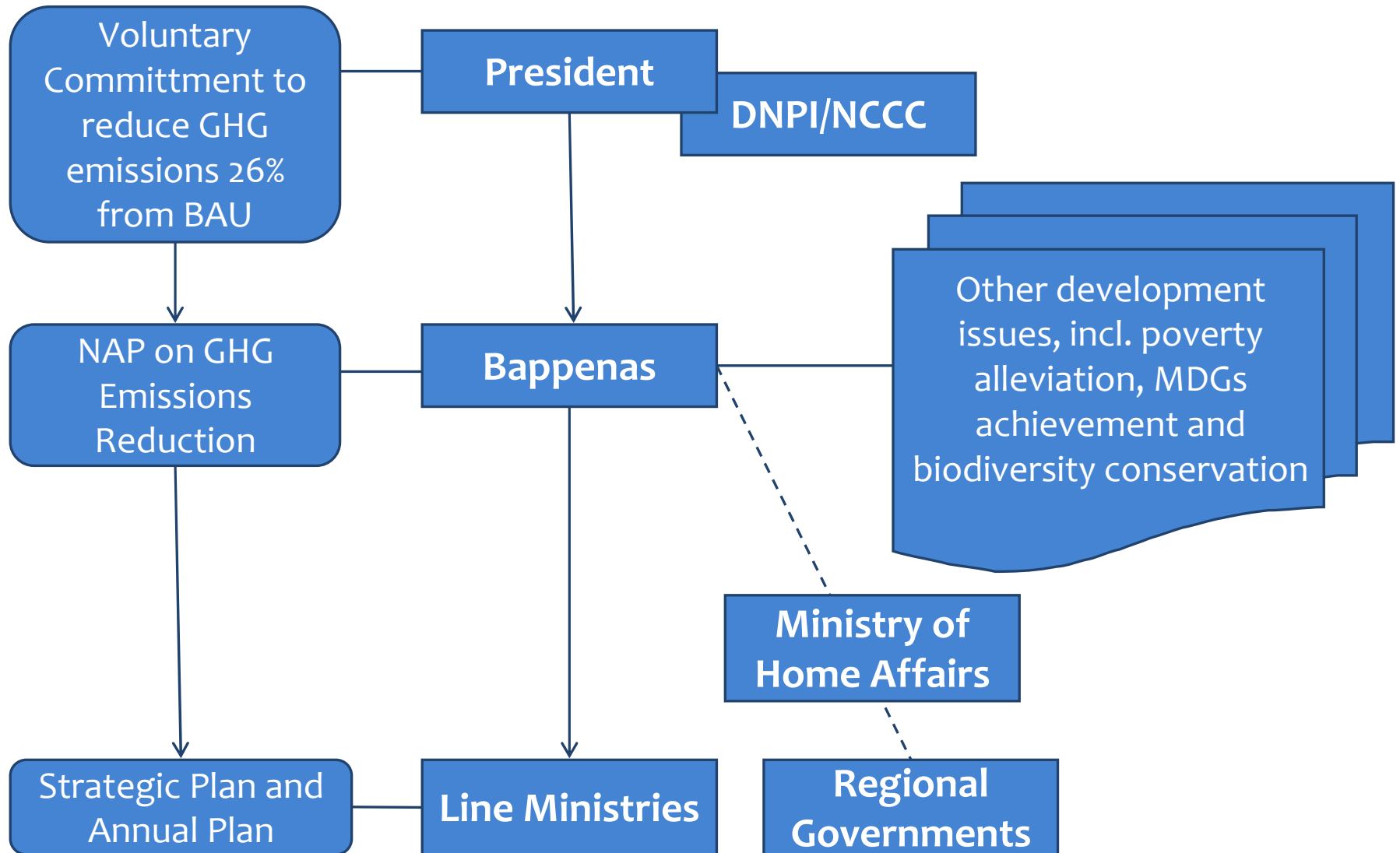

NATIONAL PRIORITY & ACTION PLAN 2010-2014

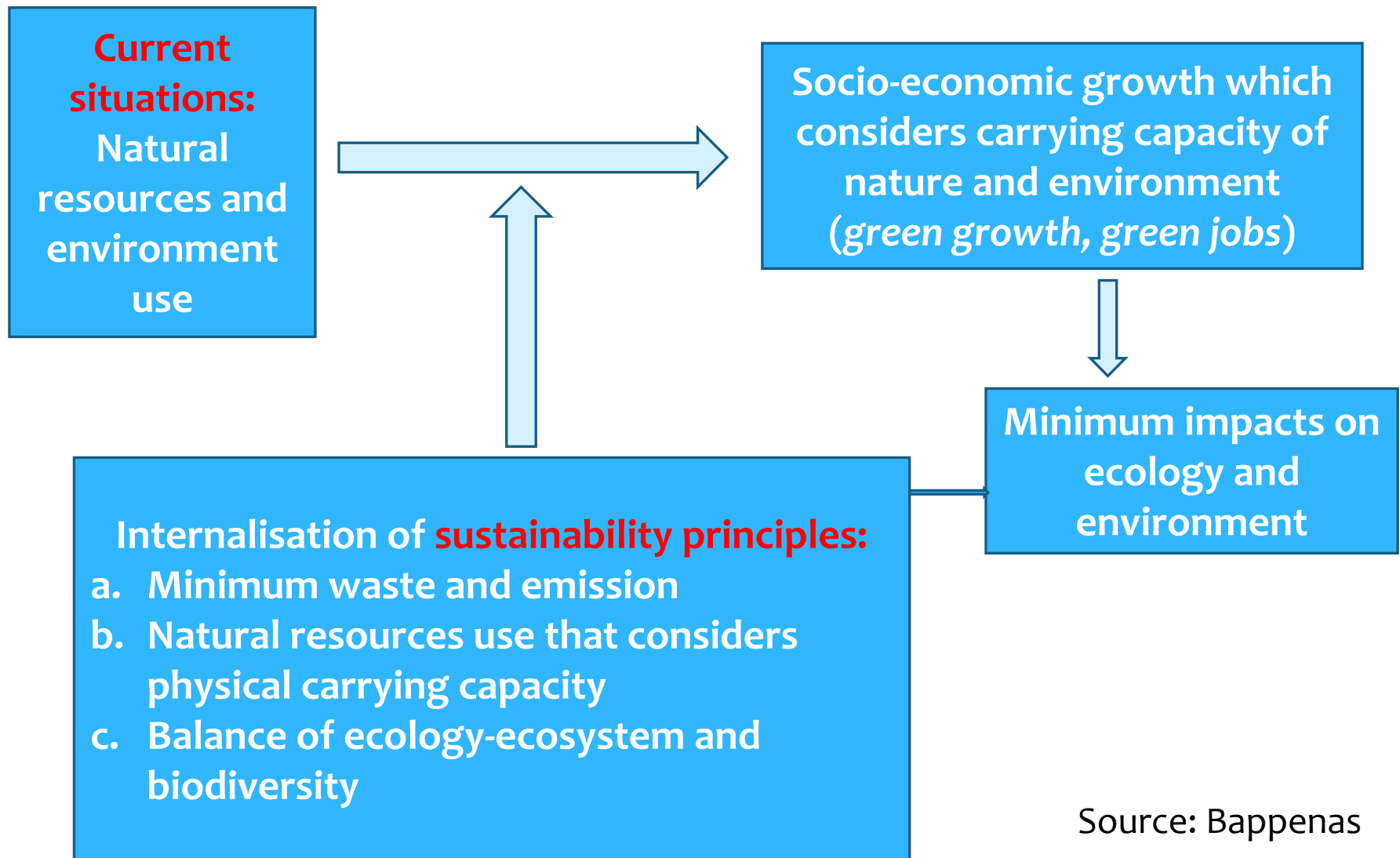

Linking Climate Change mitigation with other Development Issues toward Green Economy

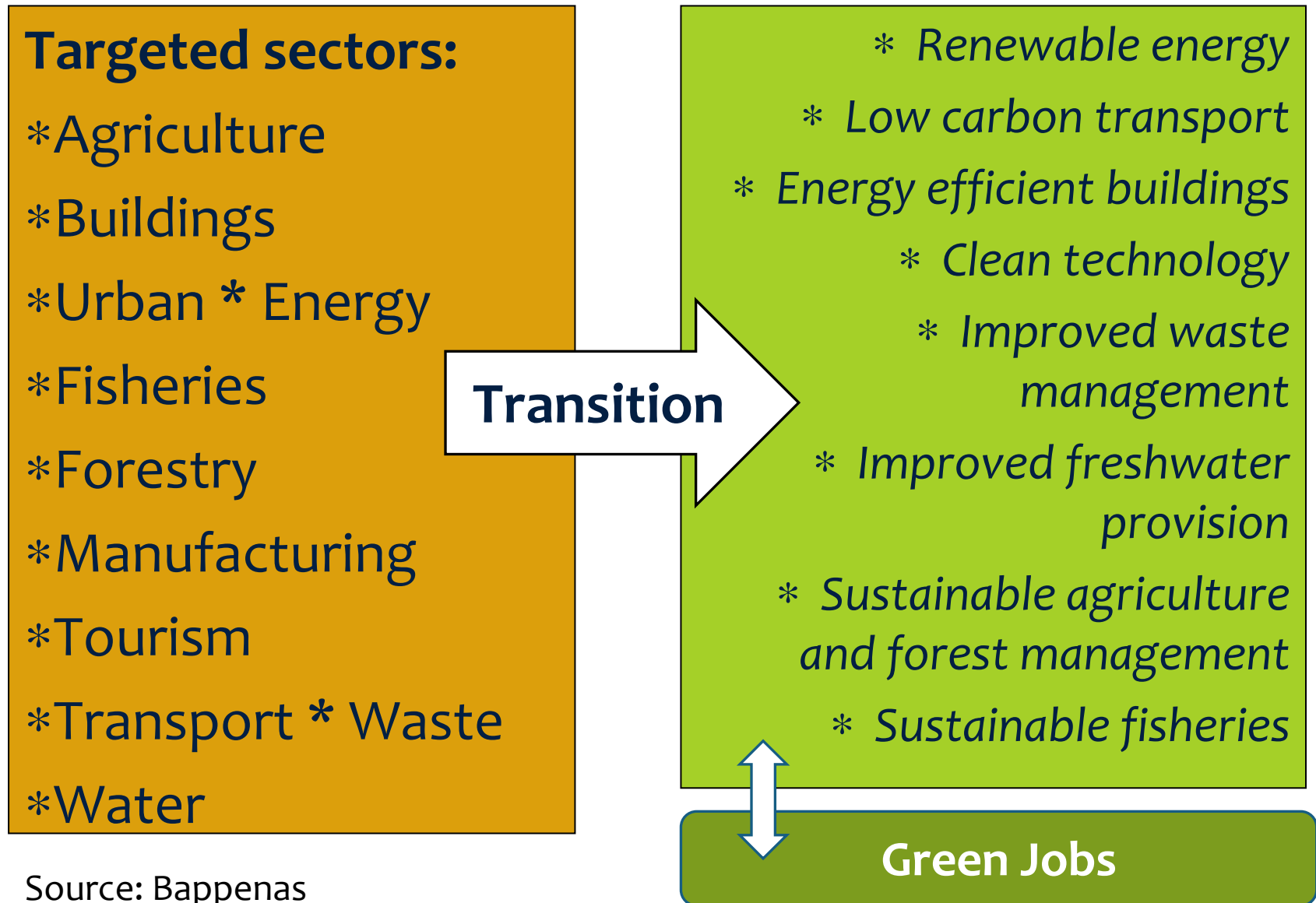


Green economy is more than just GHG emissions reduction...

Transition entails:

Raising awareness among all actors

Assessment

Sequencing implementation: prioritisation based on sector and regions

Assessment on: Existing conditions and changes to pursue across all sectors; Baseline data across all sectors; Gap analysis, monitoring and evaluation; Short-term trade off and ways to offset these trade-offs; Incentives and disincentives to encourage behavioural changes; How to sequence the transition toward an established condition (of green economy)
